Instructions for School and College Visits

1. OPENING AND SUGGESTED DAYS / TIMINGS


- The Gardens will remain open for the general public from 3rd February to 31st March, 2026.
- Garden will remain open from Tuesday - Sunday; recommended visiting days for schools and colleges are Tuesday - Friday
- Garden timings will be 10AM - 6PM; recommended entry time slots are 10AM - 11AM, 11AM - 12PM and 3PM - 4PM
- The Gardens will remain closed on Mondays

2. BOOKINGS AND CONFIRMATION

- **Only Online Booking:** All tickets for Amrit Udyam must be booked only. **No offline or one-the-spot booking is permitted.**
- **Booking of Tickets for a particular day shall close at 10:00 AM on the previous day**
- Schools and colleges will have three options to book their visits:
 - Online bookings on Rashtrapati Bhavan website (<https://rashtrapatibhavan.gov.in>) and follow the "Amrit Udyam" link in the "Visit" tab.

- Post completion of booking, a confirmation will be shared with respective schools and colleges
- Confirmation will have a QR coded entry ticket that may be used during entry
- Maximum 100 students can be registered on a single booking. In case the number of students is more than 100, a separate booking needs to be done.
- Schools may ensure that students visit the Gardens in proper school uniform only

3. ENTRY PROCESS

- Entry to Gardens will be through Gate No. 35 of the Rashtrapati Bhavan on North Avenue Road (*outlined in the map below*)
- Schools and colleges are required to arrive at the entry gate as per time slot booked by them
- Each accompanying teacher shall carry the booking QR code on their phones to facilitate the entry of students

Brief Primer for School and College Visits

BACKGROUND

The Amrit Udyan will remain open to the general public from 3rd February to 31st March, 2026.

This edition of the flowering extravaganza will especially focus on welcoming school and college students, and give them a glimpse of Amrit Udyan, the gardens of Rashtrapati Bhavan. This document is being shared with institutes to enable faculties to brief students about what they can expect to see on their visit to Amrit Udyan.

We hope this primer will help build excitement among our young visitors about their trip to Amrit Udyan.

KEY ATTRACTIONS

1. **Bal Vatika**

A dedicated garden specially for children which includes swings and slides, a Nature's trail, a speaking tree and a Tree house. Adjacent to it is the section on Birds of Rashtrapati Bhavan.

2. **Plumeria Garden**

The Plumeria Garden is based on the theme of plumeria trees with sweet-smelling flowers. As visitors walk through, they will see mounds of different heights and sizes with wide green lawns, and pretty seasonal flower beds.

3. **Banyan Grove**

Right next to the Plumeria Garden is the peaceful Banyan Grove. Here, large banyan trees with their wide branches and hanging roots create a cool, shady place to relax. It's a perfect spot to enjoy some quiet time and connect with nature.

4. **Babbling Brook**

The Babbling Brook is a new and unique addition. It offers a calm and peaceful space, where a gentle stream flows through lush green plants and colourful flowers. The mix of flowing water, smooth stones, and vibrant greenery creates a relaxing atmosphere. It's a perfect place to enjoy the beauty of the Rashtrapati Bhavan gardens in a quiet and peaceful way.

5. **Bonsai Garden**

Set up in 2010 with around 360 Bonsai plants. Varieties include Ficus Infactoria, Ficus Panda, etc.

6. **East Lawn & Central Lawn**

Consists of flower beds, fountains, water channels, terraces and. These flower beds are planted with 120 varieties of roses, Tulips and 70 varieties of seasonal flowers.

7. Long Garden

Consists of rectangular and square-shaped rose beds of different varieties. Creepers along the side walls blossom with flowers in different colors. Complementing them are shrubs of Choti Narangi.

8. Circular Garden

Consists of fragrant varieties such marigold, viola, and pansies. A bubble fountain in the middle enhances the grandeur of the garden. Home to more than 25 varieties of seasonal flowers

9. Vertical Garden

An interesting picture point with myriads of plants, artistically arranged vertically.
